# Homemade Caramel Corn By: Leah Sturk

Ingredients:

10 Cups of Popped Popcorn

Salt

1 Cup Butter (Sweet Cream, Salted)
1 Cup Light Brown Sugar
2 tsp. Vanilla
1/2 tsp. Baking Soda

- 1. Make popcorn.
- 2. Salt popcorn and set aside.
- 3. Melt 1 cup of butter in a medium saucepan over medium heat.
- Add 1 cup of brown sugar and stir until thoroughly mixed.
- Stirring continuously, bring the butter and sugar mixture up to a boil on medium heat.
- When it reaches a boil allow it to cook for 5 minutes without stirring on medium heat.
- 7. Add the 2 tsp. of vanilla at the 4 minute mark and stir to mix.
- 8. Continue to boil for one addition minute and then add the 1/2 teaspoon of baking soda.
- Drizzle the caramel mixture over the popcorn.
   Use a spoon to gently fold the popcorn with the mixture until the kernels are all covered.
- Pour the popcorn out onto a cookie sheet covered with aluminum foil or a silpat liner.
- 11. Let the popcorn cool.


