American Indian & Alaskan Native Heritage Month Leah S.

Native American Heritage month is the one month of the year that we celebrate the people that lived in the Americas before colonization. This celebration first started as American Indian Day, on the second saturday in May. In 1990, George H.W. Bush approved a joint resolution designating November, and now every November, as Native American Heritage Month in the United States.

In 1994 they changed the name to American Indian & Alaskan Native Heritage Month. This incorporated Alaskan natives who were also here long before colonists from other countries. In demographics American Indians and Alaskan Natives are "One of the six major race categories", defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget. This month is utilized to celebrate the many unique tribes of people who lived in the Americas prior to the colonists and contributed to where we are today.





Band Step Up Night!


