Women's History Month was originally Women's History Day during February 1909. It was a commemoration for the one year anniversary of the Garment Weather Strike. This was a strike where 15,000+ women protested about their working conditions in factories in Manhattan, NY. Most were young teenage women who were working in packed factories with sewing machines for 12+ hours each day for minimal money. These factories were not held to working standards, and one factory even burned down in 1911, killing 145 women.

Women's History Month is a month to reflect on how women have fought hard for a long time to earn equal rights in the United States. These events have impacted our country and its history. March represents the milestones that brave, powerful women have went through to get where we are today, and to celebrate those achievements. ## The HMS Cheerleading Team's Season


From fundraising \$256 that was donated to the #SupportUkraine War Relief Fund, to hosting a local cheer team showcase with the AHS Unified Cheer Team, to earning 1st place in 2023 Tri-County Cheerleading Championship at Nashua South the team has done so much! At the Championships the cheerleaders scored an impressive 87.1 points, 14 points over 2nd place, and won against 11 teams! This is the third Tri-County Championship year in a row now for the Colts! But these amazing girls didn't stop there, as they also won 1st place honors at the Capital City Cheerleading competition at Concord High School the next day! Each 8th grader invited a staff member from HMS to the competition that has played an important role to them.

There are six cheerleaders this year that are now 8th graders and will be moving on to high school. We interviewed two of thse students to hear their thoughts on the HMS Cheer Team during the time they've spent here. Both stated that "My entire experience on the HMS Cheerleading Team was and is amazing!". One 8th grader had been on the team all 3 years and stated that what they love about the team is "how organized we are. We always have some sort of game plan going into practice and that helps a lot! I also love how hard we work. Hard working teams like ours is the true key to success." Another 8th grade student that was on the team for 7th & 8th grade stated that what they love most about the team is "how we all work as a family and 'fill each other's tanks up'. Our team had some discouraging down moments prior to the competitions with injuries and other things but we pushed through and persevered. We practiced 5 days a week, sometimes even more to prepare for the competitions."

Both 8th graders interviewed stated that they "were extremely nervous but still held their heads high for the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7th graders as we went into our competitions, which paid off". There is clearly an amazing sense of teamwork, leadership, and mentoring that happens within the HMS Cheer Team between veteran cheerleaders and those newer to the team. Next year, most of the 8th graders plan to try out for the AHS Cheer Team, but stated that they "will miss HMS Cheer in ways we can't even explain. It's made us the people, and cheerleaders, that we are today, mostly because of our coaches. Without them, we wouldn't be where we are now".


