-Blurb: A walk in the park will never be the same after kids discover this awe-inspiring book about trees.


Comprehension Questions

- -Tell me 3 facts you learned while reading your book?
- -What was the main idea of the story?
- -Tell me a new or interesting word you read in the book and what does it mean?
- -What did you find most interesting while you were reading?
- -What is the problem in the story?

It's that time of year again, all viruses are upon us. Common Cold...A cold is a viral infection marked by runny nose or nasal congestion, sore throat, cough, or headache. Children may also have fevers early in the illness. The fevers are usually low grade. Colds are caused by many different types of virus and can occur year round, although they are most frequent in the winter months. Most colds worsen over 3-5 days and then begin to improve with complete resolution of symptoms in about 7-10 days. Children often get 10 or more colds per vear!
